In order for this initiative to continue beyond the initial 18-month period, we will require additional support from our generous donors. We look forward to seeing the positive impact this will have on our community as we know many have asked for a Bus in Queensland.

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KH4LBETTER KIDNEY HEALTH 4 EVERYONE

Kidney Health Australia is embarking on an exciting pilot program this year called Kidney Health 4 Life, to offer tailored and holistic support for people living with kidney disease and their carers. The program will then be assessed to determine the impact and understand how Kidney Health Australia might be able to provide this support ongoing.

Research facilitated by Kidney Health Australia last year with the support of research agency Atlantis Health identified key themes for people living with kidney disease and their carers, such as lack of knowledge about the kidney disease journey, loss of control over individual health, isolation felt by patients and carers, as well as the need for mental health and peer support.

The pilot program will run this year and recruitment for participants will be conducted from May. Keep your eyes peeled for more information via email and social media.

To welcome a child into the world is one of life's greatest joys but joy can quickly turn to heartache when your precious baby is diagnosed with a chronic illness.

Kidneys GO TO CANBERRA!

On **World Kidney Day** 9th March, Kidney Health Australia, our community ambassadors and key stakeholders went to Parliament House in Canberra to put early detection of kidney disease on the agenda of our politicians.

The event gave everyone - including politicians and their staff - a chance to get their kidneys checked for free, with doctors, nurses and pathologists on site.

Most importantly, Ministers were invited to a launch of the Deloitte Access Economics report, titled 'Changing the chronic kidney disease landscape: The economic benefits of early detection and treatment'.

The ground-breaking report outlines the need for early detection to reduce the economic, social and human impact of late-stage treatment. It was found that for every \$1 invested in early detection, \$45 can be saved. This is a serious incentive for investing in early detection and treatment of kidney disease now, and Kidney Health Australia will be actively advocating for these changes in the years to come.

As a nurse, Andrea understood the impacts of her father's diagnosis. With time, Des' kidney function declined until he went into kidney failure. He then began a journey that lasted 20 years with his family and nephrologist by his side. After 6 months of dialysis, Des went into palliative care.
